Introduction

The Bucker Fisher handbook is a helpful and easy guide to what will soon become your favorite pastime: bucket fishing. Simple and fun, bucket fishing is an enjoyable way to relax and fish without having to travel from your home area. Without instruction, however, bucket fishing can be potentially dangerous, as well as difficult to learn. But with our help, you will an expert in no time! So take the time to thoroughly read this entire manual, and then discover the excitement of bucket fishing!

Section I: Getting Ready

Part I: Supplies

Included in *The Bucket Fisher* kit are most of the supplies you will need to get started: one (1) deluxe model fishing pole, one (1) deluxe model fishing bucket, and one (1) deluxe edition bucket fisher handbook. The other items that are needed for bucket fishing are: one (1) bucketful of water and one (1) roll of duct tape. The uses for each of these items will be explained to you in full detail later in this handbook.

Part II: Finding a Location

Location is everything. When you are bucket fishing, a place outside is always preferred. Whether you sit on your front porch, back porch, lawn, beneath some trees, or even up in a tree (we do not advise this, as it is potentially dangerous) is completely up to you. Just so long as the place you choose is comfortable and able to keep a bucket from tipping, practically anywhere will do.

Part III: Setting Up

After you have chosen a location for bucket fishing, it is necessary that you prepare and set up your equipment.

First, fill your deluxe model bucket with water, making sure to keep the water level below the top of the bucket's plastic lining. To do this, either hold the bucket under a sink faucet then turn the faucet on to let water fill it, or set the bucket on the ground and use a hose to fill it with water. Be careful, because you do not want to get water everywhere nor do you want too much water—it is potentially dangerous.

Secondly, carry the bucket of water to your chosen location. Take caution, as the water is liable to slosh and spill. Set the bucket about two feet away from the place you will be sitting.

Thirdly, take your deluxe model fishing pole, roll of duct tape, and *The Bucket Fisher* handbook to your chosen location. Set the handbook and the duct tape nearby, holding the fishing pole in your hands.

Holding the fishing pole is not difficult. Simply grip the pole with one hand about two inches above the end without the string, placing your second hand about half an inch above the first. If this position is uncomfortable, feel free to attempt holding the pole another way—use caution, however, as this could be potentially dangerous.

When you are finished setting up your equipment, congratulations! You are ready to begin bucket fishing!

Part IV: Helpful Tips

In this part, we will tell you various tips and tricks we have discovered to make the setting up phase of bucket fishing quicker and easier.

Tip #1: When carrying your deluxe model bucket to your chosen location, we suggest that you walk, not run, as walking better insures the safety of both you and your bucket.

Tip #2: We also would like to add that running increases the risk of sloshing water, which, if is spilled on the ground, increases the risk of slipping, which increases the risk of falling, which increases the risk of doing damage to both yourself and your deluxe model fishing bucket.

Tip #3: When holding your deluxe model fishing pole, it is advised that you do not wave it around, as that increases the risk of hitting, poking, or otherwise damaging any people or objects near you.

Tip #4: We also recommend that you exercise extreme caution while wielding both your deluxe model fishing pole and your deluxe model fishing bucket.

Tip #5: When choosing a location, we would like you to consider the possibility of choosing a potentially dangerous location, and therefore choose to sit on the ground.

Tip #6: In addition to Tip #5, we would like to say that grassy areas are more comfortable and moderately safer than rocky areas.

Tip #7: Lastly, it is advised that you keep your roll of duct tape close at hand at all times, because you never know what may happen next.

Section II: Bucket Fishing

Part I: Casting the Line

Once you have finished setting up, you can begin bucket fishing! But first, you must cast your line into the water of the deluxe edition fishing bucket. To do this, carefully pick up the end of your line and set it inside the bucket. This method is the safest, however, if you wish to attempt casting your line another way, feel free to do so. Use caution, as this could be potentially dangerous.

Part II: Fishing

Sit back, relax, and enjoy the time you spend bucket fishing! Because your bucket does not magically produce fish, do not expect to actually catch anything. Instead, hold the deluxe model fishing pole somewhat loosely in your hands and let your eyes stare at the water in the deluxe model fishing bucket while your thoughts drift away. This, as we may have said already, is very peaceful and relaxing, as well as an enjoyable way to spend your time. Bucket fish for as long as you would like, from five mintues to three hours, or any increment of time you wish.

Part III: Helpful Tips

In this part, we will tell you various tips and tricks we have discovered to make the fishing phase of bucket fishing quicker and easier.

Tip #1: If, when fishing, your chosen location does not have a back rest or something you can lean back on, we advise against leaning back.

Tip #2: We would also like to add that leaning back if you have no back rest increases the risk of tipping over backwards, which increases the risk of bonking your head on the ground, which is not very pleasant.

Tip #3: When casting your line, we suggest that you not swing, fling, or otherwise wave your line around.

Tip #4: Swinging, flinging, or otherwise waving your line around is potentially dangerous, as it increases the risk of hitting people or objects near you with the end, middle, or beginning of your line and/or deluxe model fishing pole.

Tip #5: When bucket fishing, we advise against fishing for long periods of time, as sitting still on any ground for long periods of time can make certain body parts tired, numb, or otherwise incapable of sitting still any longer.

Tip #6: In addition to Tip #5, we would like to say that you are allowed to take breaks from bucket fishing.

Tip #7:We recommend not staring directly at the water in your deluxe model fishing bucket if the sun is reflecting off of it, because doing so increases the risk of eye damage.

Tip #8: Lastly, it is advised that you keep your roll of duct tape close at hand at all times, because you never know what may happen next.

Section III: Everything Else You Need to Know Part I: Proper Care

Taking care of all your bucket fishing equipment is crucial, because if any of your equipment is not cared for properly, your bucket fishing experience may not be the best. Using equipment that has not been properly cared for is also potentially dangerous.

To keep your deluxe model fishing pole in excellent condition, do not store it in an un-protected area outside. This could make it wet, dirty, and undesirable to hold while bucket fishing. Store both it and your deluxe model fishing bucket in a safe, dry, place inside—your garage or a closet are ideal locations. Also, do not whack your fishing pole on people or objects, because this may cause it to break, crack, or otherwise be damaged. Pretending that your fishing pole is a sword, staff, or other weapon is also not recommended.

To keep your deluxe model fishing bucket in excellent condition, do not store it in an un-protected area outside. This could make it wet, which may cause rust, dirty, and undesirable to fish in. As stated above, storing your bucket in a safe, dry place inside, such as in your garage or in a closet, is the best way to insure good condition. Banging it against objects and or people can create dents, which are not pretty, so this is not advised.

Lastly, to keep *The Bucket Fisher* handbook nice, do not store it in an unprotected area outside. A safe, dry place inside, such as a bookshelf, is the ideal location. Also, turning pages gently helps prevent tearing, and careful usage will insure better condition for a longer period of time.

Part II: If Something Breaks

If any of your equipment breaks, you can quickly mend it using your roll of duct tape. If you are at all experienced in the use of duct tape, this should be simple. If you are not experienced, that is not our problem. Repairing any broken equipment in this fashion will suffice for a time, but replacing that broken thing is the most desirable fix. We sell deluxe model fishing poles, deluxe model buckets, and the deluxe edition of *The Bucket Fisher* handbook, as well as various other models and editions. Part III: Helpful Tips

In this part, we will tell you various tips and tricks we have discovered to make caring for your equipment and fixing broken equipment quicker and easier.

Tip #1: When mending broken fishing buckets, we suggest dumping out the water before trying to do anything, because otherwise it might spill.

Tip #2: Water, when spilled on the ground, increases the risk of slipping, which increases the risk of falling, which increases the risk of doing more damage to both yourself and your deluxe model fishing bucket.

Tip #3: When repairing broken fishing poles, we recommend that you use extreme caution, because poking yourself while mending the pole is not the most pleasant experience.

Tip #4: When storing your bucket fishing equipment, we advise against storing it on top of tall stacks, on unstable surfaces, or in places that are potentially dangerous.

Tip #5: We would also like to add that storing bucket fishing equipment in potentially dangerous place is potentially dangerous.

Tip #6: Lastly, it is advised that you keep your roll of duct tape close at hand at all times, because you never know what may happen next.
